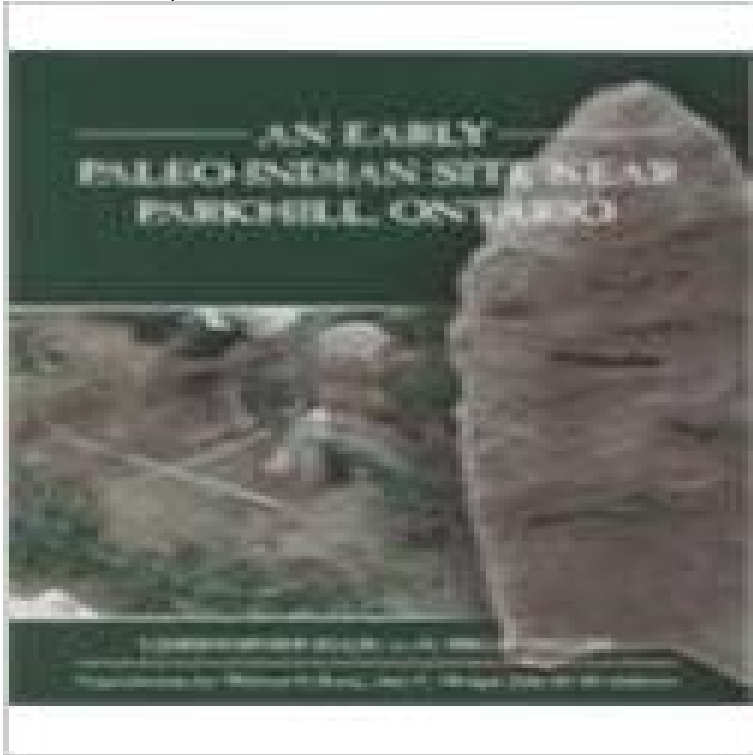


An Early Paleo-Indian Site Near Parkhill, Ontario (Mercury)

The history of museums and their lack of response to this major component of Canadian culture combined with the fate of various craft collections raise important, ongoing questions.
