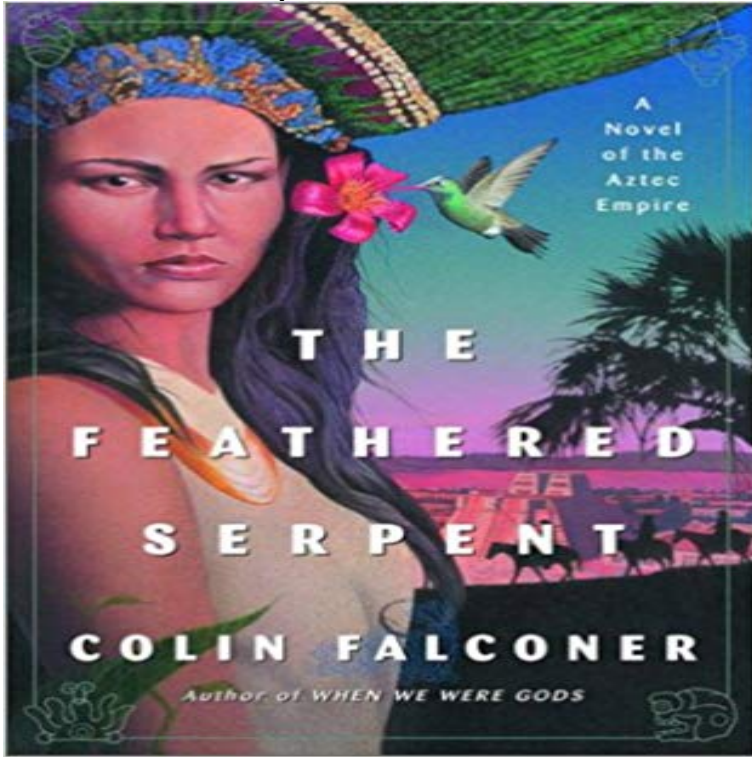


Feathered Serpent
