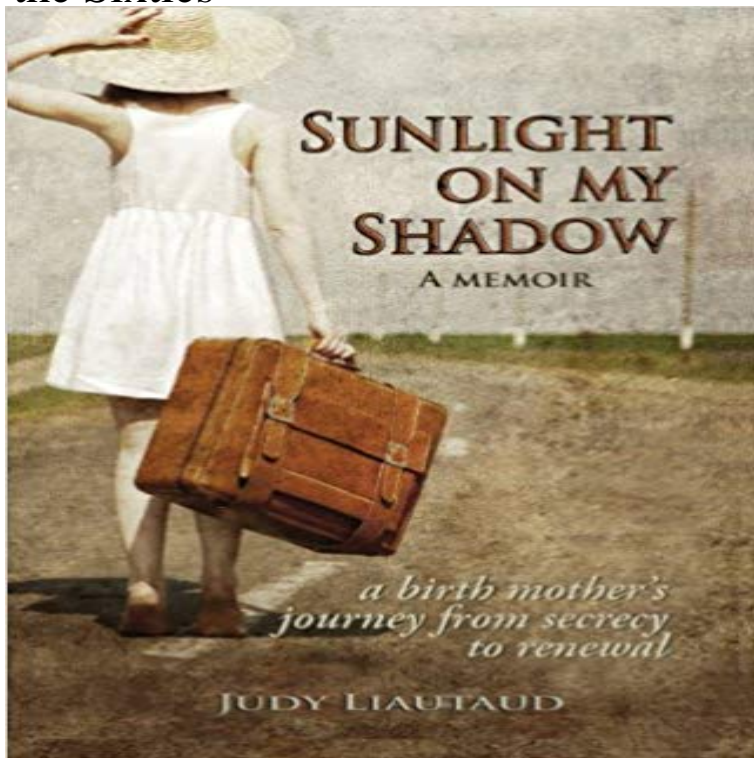


# Sunlight on My Shadow: A Girl Who Went Away: Secret Pregnancy in the Sixties
