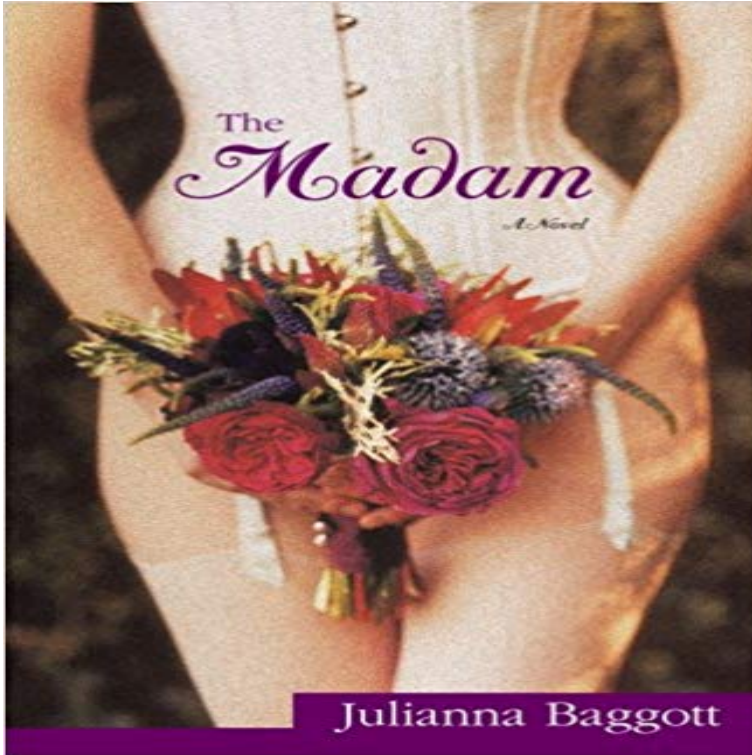


The Madam: A Novel
