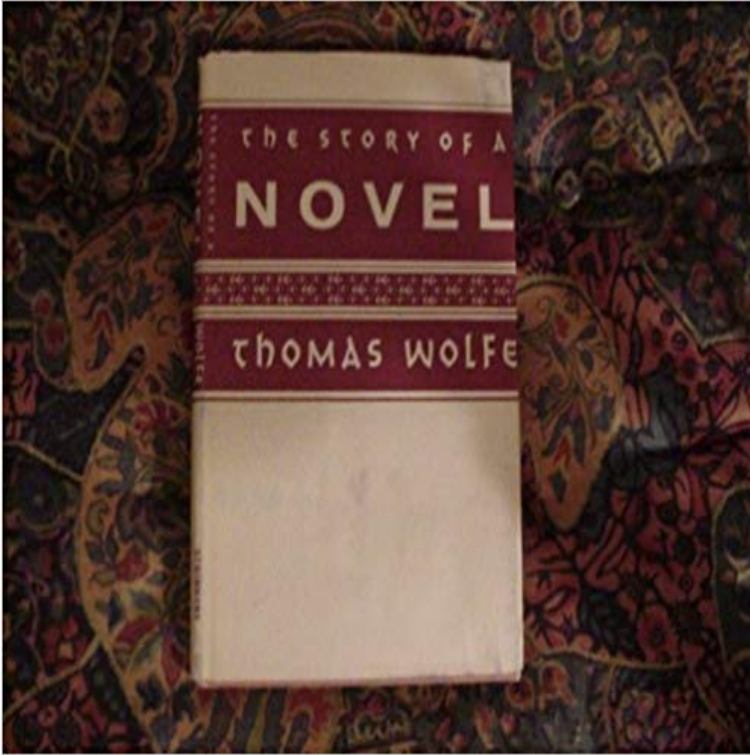


# The Story of a Novel
