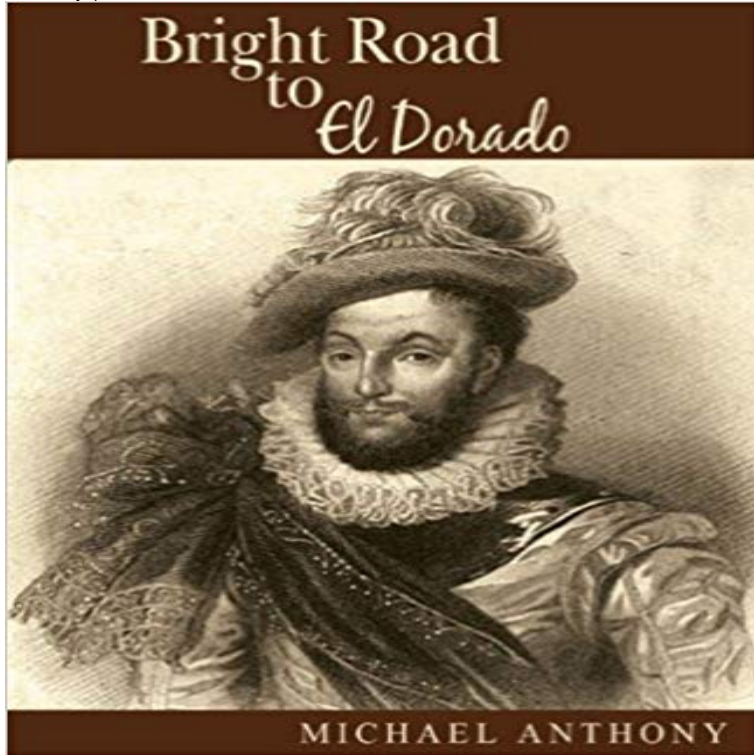


Bright Road to El Dorado
