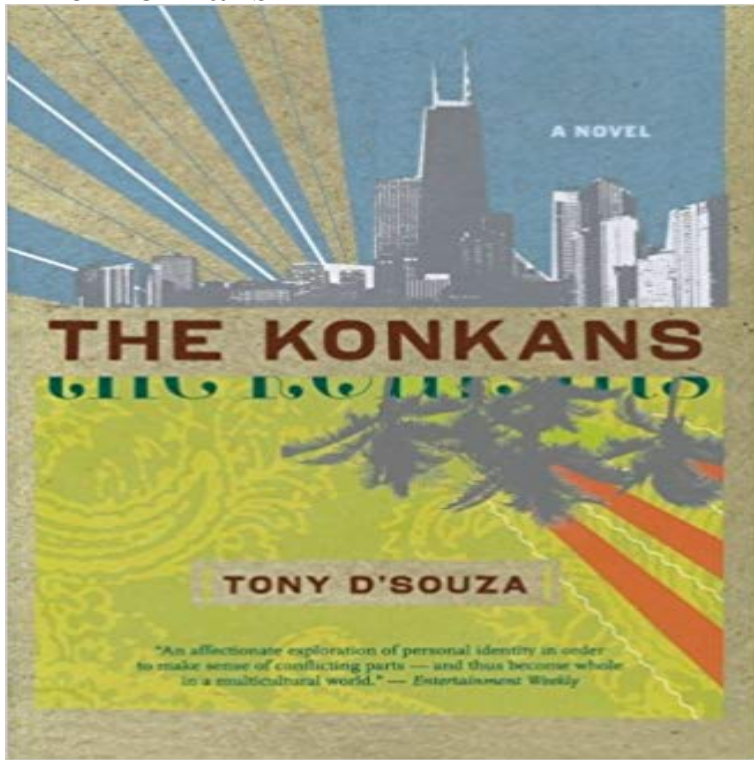


The Konkans
